
Auckland's mix of big city style and beautiful landscapes open endless possibilities to reward and inspire.

GETTING TO NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand is easily accessible from overseas. It is an 11 hour direct flight from most places in the Pacific Rim, including Singapore, Hong Kong, Tokyo and the West Coast of the USA and only a three hour flight for neighbouring Pacific Islands and the eastern seaboard of Australia.

New Zealand is serviced by all major airlines including members of Star Alliance, Oneworld and SkyTeam.

Auckland offers regular daily flights to all the country's main centres and popular tourist destinations.



Getting around Auckland

Māori culture

Māori are the tangata whenua, the indigenous people of Aotearoa New Zealand, and their culture is an integral part of what makes New Zealand so unique. Guests are presented with diverse opportunities to experience Māori culture first-hand.

Observe Māori culture on a marae, which is a sacred communal meeting space. Visit a marae to experience a traditional Māori welcome, hear Māori speeches and singing, see carved meeting houses, greet locals with a hongi (pressing of noses) and enjoy a Hāngi feast cooked in a traditional earth oven – food infused with a smoky, earthy fragrance.

Enjoy the kapa haka, a performance that incorporates harmonious singing and rhythmic dancing, and includes the skilled demonstrations of the poi and traditional weaponry. The haka is the spine tingling war dance which is a must-see whilst in New Zealand.




Island adventures




Wellness & relaxation

Explore a little further afield


Visit some must-see attractions all a short drive from Auckland's city centre.

Experience the real Middle-earth with a visit to the Hobbiton™ Movie Set in Waitomo, featured in *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit* films. Take a look at Bag End, where Frodo and Bilbo's adventures began. Get lost among the hobbit holes and visit the Green Dragon Inn, the Mill and the Party Tree, listening to spell-binding tales of how Hobbiton came to be.

Further afield, under the green hills of Waitomo lies a labyrinth of caves, sinkholes and underground rivers. The easiest way to see the Waitomo Caves is with a walking or boat tour. The more adventurous should try the unique experience of black water rafting - crawl, swim and float through the caves on a rubber tube. Or abseil or zip-line through the darkness exploring an incredible wonder of nature.
