



#### January 2024

A comprehensive and up-to-date overview of Auckland's visitor economy – from the latest arrival, accommodation, spend, events and tourism sentiment data.

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#### INTERNATIONAL

- Monthly international visitors (219.0k) were up 27.3% on January 2023 (172.0k) but numbers were down 23.2% compared to January 2020 pre-Covid (285.3k).
- The year to January 2024 saw 2.08m international visitor arrivals, an increase of 83.9% on 2023. However, international visitation was down 23.8% compared to pre-Covid levels (2.73m in YE January 2020).
- There was an increase in visitors from the Australian market in January 2024, with 60.9k visitors, up 4.2% compared to last year. The year to January 2024 saw 687.1k Australian visitors, up 29.7%.
- Holiday visitors (828.6k) contributed the most to annual visitor numbers and increased 143.5% in the year to January 2024. Monthly numbers (104.2k) were up 39.2% compared with January 2023.
- VFR visitors (747.5k) were up 41.2% for the year, with monthly numbers (69.0k) up 13.0%.
- 326.2k international guest nights in commercial accommodation for January, up 27.1% on last year.

#### DOMESTIC

- The domestic visitor numbers are no longer available as the Ministry of Business, Innovation, and Employment (MBIE) has cancelled the Monthly Unique Regional Population Estimates (MURPEs) data until further notice.
- There were **396.9k domestic guest nights in commercial accommodation** for the month of **January, down 7.8%**.
- At present, we cannot display current spend data from the Monthly Regional Tourism Estimates (MRTEs) as this dataset has been paused by MBIE (due to the disestablishment of Data Ventures – a branch of Stats NZ which occurred in December 2023).
- Regional spend data for domestic and international visitors to Auckland will be reported again once the issue has been remedied.

#### OVERALL

- For the month of January 2024, there were 723.1k total guest nights in commercial accommodation in Auckland, up 5.2% on last year.
- On average, visitors stayed in Auckland for 2.1 nights in January 2024 (no change on the previous year).
- Average hotel Occupancy for the month was 66.6%, 4.9% higher compared to January 2023.
- The Average Daily Rate for January was \$231 (down 6.2%) and the RevPAR was \$154 (down 2.2% compared to the previous year).
- The average daily rate (ADR) for hotels in Auckland was the highest for the month on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024 at \$268 (up 2.5% on the previous year). This is when the ASB Classic event commenced.
- Looking forward (over the next twelve months), overall occupancy on the books is generally higher for the period from March 2024 to February 2025 in comparison to last year.
- Occupancy on the books peaked at 97% on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024, when P!NK performed at Eden Park.

# **Auckland Tourism – Visitor Arrivals Data**

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
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#### 2.08m International visitor arrivals in the year to January 2024, up 83.9%

- The month of January saw 219.0k international visitors, up 27.3% on January 2023 (172.0k) but down 23.2% compared to pre-Covid numbers (285.3k in January 2020).
- The year to January 2024 saw 2.08m international visitor arrivals, an increase of 83.9% on the previous year. However, international visitation was down 23.8% compared to pre-Covid levels (2.73m in YE January 2020).
- Holiday visitors (828.6k) contributed the most to annual visitor numbers and increased 143.5% on the year to January 2024. Monthly holiday numbers (104.2k) were also up 39.2% compared with the month of January 2023.
- VFR visitors (747.5k) were up 41.2% for the year, with monthly numbers (69.0k) up 13.0%.
- There were 151.4k business visitors (up 66.1%) in the year to January 2024, and 8.9k for the month (up 17.5%).



#### 687.1k visitors from Australia for YE January 2024, up 29.7%


- There was an increase in Australian visitors in the month of January 2024, with 60.9k visitors, up 4.2% compared to last January. The year to January 2024 saw 687.1k Australian visitor arrivals, up 29.7%.
- The year to January 2024 saw 283.8k visitors from the US (up 133.1%), with 37.5k visitors for the month (up 38.9%).
- Visitors from China (148.4k) were also up for the year (620.3%), and up (264.0%) for the month of January (to 16.3k).
- For the year to January 2024, there were 123.5k visitor arrivals from the UK (up 42.6%) and 19.3k visitors for the month (up 3.1%).










#### Auckland has seen a 83.9% increase in international visitor arrivals over the last year

- In the five years proceeding the arrival of Covid in 2020, all major airports had seen steady increases in international visitor arrivals.
- The Covid-related travel bans had a clear effect on all ports with the greatest impact seen in Auckland reflecting the largest market share.
- However, with NZ borders fully open (since July 2022), Auckland has seen an 83.9% increase in international visitor arrivals over the last year.
- For the year ending January 2024, all other ports saw growth in international visitor arrivals in comparison to last year. Queenstown saw an increase of 62.3%, Christchurch was up 77.4% and Wellington was up 49.3% compared to last year.

#### 12 month rolling visitor arrivals




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#### 723.1k total guest nights in commercial accommodation in January 2024, up 5.2%

- For the month of January 2024, there were 723.1k total guest nights in commercial accommodation in Auckland, up 5.2% on the same month last year.
- There were 396.9k domestic guest nights in commercial accommodation (down 7.8), and 326.2k international guest nights (up 27.1%) in commercial accommodation in January 2024.
- For New Zealand overall, there were 5.02m guest nights in commercial accommodation in January 2024, up 4.3% compared to January 2023.

#### 433.7k guest nights in hotels in January 2024, up 7.3%

- For the month of January 2024, there were 433.7k guest nights in hotels in Auckland, up 7.3% compared to January last year.
- There were 124.4k guest nights in motels and apartments (6-20), up 286.3% on the previous year.
- However, guest nights in motels and apartments (>20) (31.2k) were down (76.5%).
- Guest nights in holiday parks and campgrounds (67.0k) were up (27.9%) for the month of January.
- Guest nights in backpacker accommodation increased (up 8.1% to 50.8k) in January 2024.
- Guest nights in lodges and boutique accommodation were also up (6.7% to 15.9k) for the month.

#### Average Occupancy for January 2024 was 66.6%, up 4.9% on 2023

- For the month of January 2024, the average Occupancy was 66.6%, 4.9% higher compared to January 2023.
- The Average Daily Rate (ADR) for the month was \$231, down
   6.2% on last year.
- Monthly Revenue per available room (RevPAR) for January was \$154, 2.2% lower compared to last year.
- There were large fluctuations in percentage change for ADR, RevPAR and Occupancy rates in January 2024. ADR peaked on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> January while Occupancy and RevPAR peaked on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

Percent Changes for the Month of January






#### Average daily rate was \$268 on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024, up 2.5% on 2023

- The average daily rate (ADR) for hotels in Auckland was the highest for the month on Monday 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024 at \$268 (up 2.5% on the previous year). This is when the ASB Classic event commenced.
- Hotel occupancy reached 82.5% on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2024 (up 3.5% on the previous year), which was the weekend of Auckland Anniversary.
- Revenue per available room (RevPAR) peaked to \$211 also on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2024. However, this was down 14.2% in comparison to last year.

#### On average, visitors stayed 2.1 nights in Auckland for the month of January 2024

- On average, visitors stayed in Auckland for 2.1 nights for the month of January 2024 (no change on the previous year).
- There has been a slight downward trend in average length of stay for visitors to Auckland over the last three years.



#### **90 Day Forward Booking Occupancy Data**

- Looking forward (over the next twelve months), overall occupancy on the books is generally higher for the period from March 2024 to February 2025 in comparison to last year.
- Average monthly occupancy is currently lower for March, May and August 2024 than the same months in 2023.
- There is considerable variance in hotel occupancy when comparing the next three months of 2024 to last year.
- Occupancy on the books peaked at 97% on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2024, when P!NK performed at Eden Park.
- Occupancy also reached 94% on Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2024.



Occupancy Historical (2022 comparison) ----- Pick up - This year (2024)




#### **Longer term projections**

- In addition to the STR Global 90 Day Forward Booking data we receive, we also receive a longer-term outlook, with forecast data for the next four years until 2027. This data is provided by STR Global in collaboration with Oxford Tourism Economics.
- In 2023 Q3 supply expanded 2.5%. Demand expanded 33.6%, resulting in an occupancy gain of 30.3%. Occupancy is expected to grow by 10.8% in 2023 Q4, with supply expanding 3.6% and demand expanding 14.8%.
- After expanding 3.2% in 2022, occupancy is expected to expand 33.3% in 2023. ADR is expected to increase 7.7%, resulting in RevPAR growth of 43.6% in 2023. RevPAR is expected to grow by 1.4% in 2024.
- Over the next three years, occupancy is expected to expand at an average annual rate of 10.9%, while ADR is expected to expand at an average annual rate of 3.2%.

#### **15.8k average daily** rooms available in 2023, with 17.0k rooms forecast for 2024

- In 2023, on average there were 15.8k daily rooms available in Auckland. The number of average daily rooms available is set to increase by 3.2%, which will supply an additional 494 rooms (compared to 2022).
- Looking to 2024, average room supply is expected to expand 7.4%, supplying 1.2k new rooms and bringing the total number of rooms to 17.0k.
- Observing rooms by phase data, there was a total of 18,6k rooms (from 226 properties) in the pipeline.
- This comprised of 15.9k existing rooms (from 210 properties, 1.9k rooms under construction (from 11 properties), and 881 rooms in the planning stages (from 5 properties).



#### In total, 3.78m visitors are projected to visit New Zealand in YE January 2028

- International overnight visitor arrival projections until 2028 are available for New Zealand overall – of which Auckland receives the largest share.
- International visitor growth to New Zealand is forecast with a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 29.1% from 2023 to 2028 (for Q3 2023), resulting in a possible 3.78m international visitors by YE January 2028.
- When calculated against the 2022 baseline a clear recovery trend in visitor arrivals is visible overall – as well as for our key markets.
- Visitor arrivals from Australia are expected to grow at an average annual rate of 4.2%. 1.49m Australian visitors are expected to visit New Zealand in the year to January 2028 (bringing visitation close to pre-Covid levels of 1.54m in 2020).

\* International visitation by city is based on the Global City Travel (GCT) database maintained by Tourism Economics. GCT tracks overnight visits by international visitors to 300 global cities. The data is tracked by country of origin on an annual basis, including historical and forecast years. The data shown here for the country is taken from the Global Travel Service (GTS) database, also maintained by Tourism Economics. This reflects international visitation by origin market, including historical and forecast years.

- Regional spend data for domestic and international visitors to Auckland will be reported again once the issue has been remedied.









## **ASB Classic**

The <u>ASB Classic</u> is New Zealand's premier tennis tournament played at the ASB Tennis Arena in Auckland. It features world-class tennis players, plus fashion, food and live entertainment.

#### Key Insight

- **40k+ tickets sold**, all time sales record for the event (4.7% ahead of 2020 event).
- Estimated total attendance 92.3k, up 2% on 2023 event (includes competitions, officials, players, volunteers, catering staff, etc.).
- 85% of sessions sold out.
- 24% of attendees from outside of Auckland.
- Largest customer age group was 25-34 surpassing the 45-54 age group for the first time.
- 56% attendees were female.
- \$461.5k media value with 19.4m impressions.



# Auckland attracted the highest number of business delegates (84.4k) in New Zealand in Q4 Dec 2023






Auckland had the second largest market share of business events in NZ in Q4 Dec 2023



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
Business Event Market Share - Regional Comparison






#### Auckland hosted the most conferences, other business events and expos in NZ Q4 Dec 2023

- Looking at business event type, Auckland hosted the most conferences (159), other business events like social functions and Gala dinners (116), and expos (15) out of the three featured regions in Q4 Dec 2023.
- However, Wellington held the highest number of meetings (252), followed by Auckland (77) and then Christchurch (65).
- The majority of business events in Auckland were for Corporate customers (226), Associations (58) and Education customers (51).
- Among the three regions, Wellington recorded the most Government-related business events (52). This can be attributed to the fact that Wellington is home to New Zealand's Parliament.


- In Q4 2023, a third of all business events held in Auckland were smaller events hosting between 30-100 delegates (126 events). In comparison to other regions, Wellington hosted most small business events (276 events).
- 44% of business events in Auckland were medium-sized events with 168 events that hosed between 101-250 delegates.
- 19% of business events (74) in Auckland hosted between 251-500 delegates.
- Auckland had 5 large-scale events that hosted over 1,000 delegates in Q4 2023.
- In Q4 2023, two thirds of all business events (68%) in Auckland were one day events (263), while 32% were multiday events. 15% were held for a duration of two days (59), and 8% ran over the course of three days (30).

## **Net Promoter Score**

- The Net Promoter Score (NPS) is an index ranging from -100 to +100 that measures customer engagement and loyalty, based on the likelihood of customers to recommend a product or service.
- For domestic visitors in YE Jun 2022, NPS was +1. (down 6 points from YE June 2021).
- Domestic visitors most likely to recommend Auckland as a visitor destination include those aged 30-44 (NPS +6), Otago residents (NPS +16), those whose main reason to visit is a conference, convention or other business event (NPS +23), those travelling with a friend/s (NPS +6) and those who also include Northland in their itinerary (NPS +13).
- Inversely, those least likely to recommend Auckland as a visitor destination are those aged 18-29 years (NPS -8), those who used to live in the Auckland region (NPS -4), and those travelling with children (NPS -3) or with other members of their family (NPS -12).




## **Five-year visitor arrivals to Auckland, YE January**




